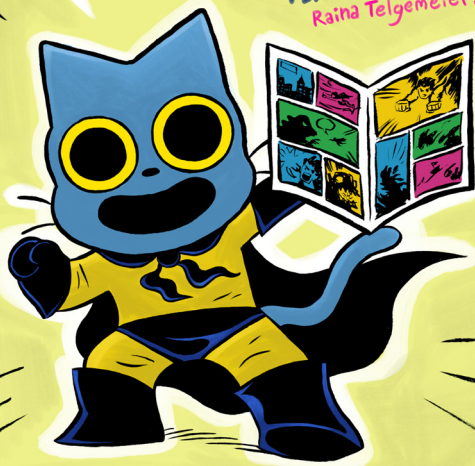

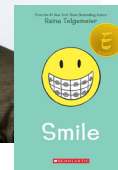

Pre-Literacy Tips

Talking:

Take a walk and talk to your child about how things are changing for fall. Discuss the changing colors, weather, temperature, and so on.

Singing:

Help increase your child's vocabulary by singing classic nursery rhymes with them, like the "Itsy Bitsy Spider", "Jack and Jill", or "Humpty Dumpty".

Reading:

Encourage children to choose their own books to read. Children are much more likely to enjoy books they pick themselves over books that are selected for them.

Writing:

Have your child practice making marks on paper that can be used to make letters; for example circles, lines, curves, etc.

Playing:

Build a cozy fort to read in using items around your house, such as blankets and small furniture. Add a basket or box filled with your child's favorite books.
