Quick Book Sharing Tips

Children love repetition! Each time you read the same book, it counts!

Count books read to your child by anyone

– older siblings, grandparents, childcare providers, and storytime librarians.

More Book Sharing Tips

- Encourage your child to point to pictures in a book and ask questions such as, "Where is the dog?' This helps teach new words.
- **Read a story with a rhythm.** Bounce, tap, or clap along with the beat or on individual syllables.
- Praise your child when they handle **books**, talk about them, and pretend to read.
- **Play, "I Spy"**, and see how many times your child can find the first letter of their name in a book. Look for words that start with a certain letter or sound.
- Keep "book time" fun cuddle, laugh, and relax!
- Encourage language skills by building on what your child says. if your child points to a ball in a book and says "buh" or "ball," build that into full sentences such as "Yes, that is a blue ball. It bounces like your ball."
- Point to the words as you read them to your child. This helps support print awareness.
